



**Directions to Mercy Hospital**

Mercy Hospital is located at 3663 South Miami Avenue, just seconds away from the Vizcaya Museum and Gardens. If you are visiting a loved one in the hospital or you have an appointment, you should park in the Visitor's Parking Garage. You will see the garage on your left hand side, as you enter the hospital grounds. Parking will cost no more than \$3.00 for up to 24 hours.

Mercy Hospital is easily accessible from I-95. If you're traveling south on I-95, take the S.W. 25th Road exit toward the Key Biscayne/Rickenbacker Causeway. You will then make a slight left on to S.W. 26th Road and an immediate right onto South Miami Avenue. Follow the signs to Mercy Hospital, which is located on the left.

If you are traveling North, take US 1 heading towards Downtown Miami, turn right at SW 17th Avenue. Proceed to South Bayshore Drive and make a left. You should then make a right on Mercy Way.

## PRESENTERS

### TODD SCHAFFHAUSER

Todd became an above knee amputee at the age of 15 as a result of cancer. Determined to regain an active lifestyle, he pursued competitive athletics for the first time in his life. In 1988, Todd qualified for the Paralympic Track and Field Team and won a gold medal by completing the 100m event. In the 1995 World Games in Germany, he broke his own world record by running the 100m in 14.55s. Todd has competed and medaled in three Paralympic Games.

Along with his athletic endeavors, Todd has worked in the prosthetic community for many years. He co-created and conducted the Fitness for Everyone clinic series that has changed the lives of thousands of amputees, their families and rehabilitation professionals worldwide. Todd became an Honorary lifetime member of the American Academy of Orthotists and Prosthetists in 2000.

### DENNIS OEHLER

Dennis Oehler became a below knee amputee at age 24 as a result of an automobile accident. Determined to resume his athletic endeavors, he tried out for the 1988 Paralympic Track and Field Team. Not only did Dennis make the team, he set a world record in the 100-meter event by running it in 11.73 seconds and went on to win gold medals in the 200 and 400-meter events. Four years later in Barcelona, he set another world record in the long jump and took silver in the 100 meters. He also brought home medals from the Atlanta Paralympics in 1996.

In 1989, Dennis co-created the Fitness for Everyone clinic designed to take amputees beyond traditional rehabilitation. This life-changing program has reached more than 7,500 amputees and 15,000 therapists worldwide.
